


Installation Instructions - Mudflap Bracket PN: 904002495

Step-by-Step Instructions

1. Preassemble

- Loosely assemble the bracket (1) and spring fingers (2), with the bolts started on the nuts (4) (5) (6).
- Attach the mudflap to the bracket using the provided bolts and backer strap. Do not overtighten.

2. Position the Bracket

- Identify the desired mounting location on the trailer crossmember.
- Hook the crossmember with the front of the bracket and bring it up flat against the crossmember.




3. Lock into Position

- Slide the spring fingers into place, ensuring they fully engage the flange.
- Confirm that the bracket sits flat and square against the mounting surface.
- Hand-tighten the nuts until snug, keeping the bracket properly aligned.



4. Tighten to Proper Clamp Deflection


Tighten each fastener evenly until the clamp fingers deflect approximately 1/8
inch. This deflection is intentional and desirable. It creates a spring-loaded
clamping force that resists vibration and loosening in service.





5. Verify Mudflap Height

- Measure from the bottom edge of the mudflap to the ground.
- Confirm that clearance is no more than 8 inches, to meet the requirement in all
 50 U.S. states.
- Adjust bracket position or flap length as needed to comply with regulations.



Notes & Best Practices

- Do not overtighten; excessive deflection may reduce the spring effect of the clamp fingers.
- Apply threadlocker to bolt threads for added vibration resistance.
- Inspect brackets after initial road use to confirm secure fit and correct mudflap height.
